

**CITY OF LYNDON
COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 24, 2018**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Those present: Betsy Kramer, Kelly Kramer, Carla Nalley, Cami Popham, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom and City Attorney John Singler. Dustin Gilchrist was absent.

A motion was made by Kelly Kramer, seconded by Cami Popham to approve the minutes of the August 27, 2018 Council Meeting. Motion carried unanimously. Motion made by Becky Ricketts, seconded by Carla Nalley to approve minutes from September 17, 2018 Caucus Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was given and will be filed for audit. Balance for September 1, 2018 was \$3,673,563.42. Discussion was held.

Mayor Hagan announced the passing of former Lyndon Councilman and retired Lyndon Chief James Baker on Friday, September 21st and spoke about his dedication to the Fire Department and to the community. Chief Baker was a councilmember for Lyndon over 10 years. A discussion was held on how the City will honor him. More details will follow.

Councilwoman Cami Popham mentioned the string of break-ins during the weekend. Her car was rummaged through. Some residents noticed the men walking through the neighborhoods and some caught them on video but no arrests have been made. LMPD made reports on activity. Discussion was held.

Councilwoman Becky Ricketts, who attended the KLC Conference, brought up that 2020 is a census year and they are looking for citizens to work, gathering information.

Councilwoman Betsy Kramer asked if the council could create some form of group communication to be better informed. Mayor suggested council members to email cell phone numbers and we will compile a list for everyone.

Mayor Hagan announced the next Caucus Meeting on October 15th and Council Meeting on October 22nd, both at 6pm.

Kent Hall, Metro Council District 7 candidate, passed out voting literature and casually spoke to council members about how he would like to serve the area. This is his second time attending a council meeting and stated he will continue rotating with other City meetings.
