CITY OF LYNDON CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, NOVEMBER 18, 2019

The Caucus Meeting was called to order by Mayor Brent Hagan at 6:00 p.m. Those present: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Kelly Kramer, Carla Nalley, Becky Ricketts, and City Attorney John Singler. Mardy Sidebottom and Amy Stuber were absent. A guest was present.

Mayor Hagan reminded council a second reading will take place of Ordinance 10-28-19, Jefferson Terrace street closure approval, on Monday night and will be up for action. He gave an update on Lyndon Lane paving and the bridge at Wood Rd.

Light Up Lyndon details were discussed along with the JCLC Dinner this Wednesday night. The Mayor informed the council there will be 4 trees planted near the carriage house at Romara which will be included in the Arbor Day Celebration. Date and time will be announced later. Also, Tee Ray is donating 14 shade trees and Lawnco, who is planting those trees, will donate two ornamental trees for the Lyndon Park Lane parking lot. In the spring, ground cover in the mulched areas and lights will be added.

The Mayor brought up an inquiry the City received about a company called Tinkergarten that conducts outdoor classes for children. The interest is to hold those classes at Robsion Park. After much discussion the council and Mayor decided since it was a "for profit" organization, that it wouldn't be conducive for our parks.

Betsy Kramer asked about the status of the home on Wood Rd. with the household items in the yard. The Mayor explained the City is taking action. Violation notices have been sent and fines have been issued. A few other addresses currently being inspected were also discussed.
