CITY OF LYNDON CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, FEBRUARY 18, 2019

The Caucus Meeting was called to order by Mayor Brent Hagan at 6:11 p.m. Those present: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Kelly Kramer, Carla Nalley, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom Amy Stuber and City Attorney John Singler. Guests were also present.
