

**CITY OF LYNDON  
CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES  
MONDAY, OCTOBER 18, 2021**

Councilmember, Susan Barto, called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Those present: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Camie Popham, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Amy Stuber and a few guests. City Attorney, John Singler was absent. Mayor Hagan will be late.

Many topics were briefly discussed. JCLC Dinner was mentioned. The owner of property by Romara Place, Mr. Samuel Berry attended to discuss the conditional use permit (CUP) he has applied for through Louisville Metro in order to be approved as a private club for a few small events. Mayor Hagan showed up at 6:09pm and entered into the conversation. He stated Mr. Singler informed him Mr. Berry could apply for a waiver to not build the fence Metro would require for the CUP. The Mayor asked Mr. Berry to keep in touch with City on his status.


Mayor Hagan updated council on plans LD&D had for Romara and Robsion Park. First, he had given council members a picture and quote on a permanent outdoor restroom for Romara Place that would belong to the City. It would require a sewage pipe to be installed for a 1 toilet/sink and possibly water fountain. It would also be easy to clean if vandalized and cost would be under \$20,000. Second, there will be an alternative plan for the new property at Lyndon Park Lane with a pavilion instead of an area for food trucks. Discussion was held. Light Up Lyndon was brought up and the possibility of having it at the new property with a food truck, Santa, lights, etc. Dates were discussed.

Mardy Sidebottom left meeting at 6:36 p.m.


Mayor Hagan informed council the ethics training session through the KLC is set for November 15<sup>th</sup> (Caucus Mtg.) with Chris Johnson officiating. Also, he let them know he had Cunningham Windows and Doors give him quotes on replacing a few windows and the front door at Romara. Quotes were very high so he will try other companies. More business was discussed regarding the proposal for new neighborhood at end of Washington, future project to widening streets and curbing in Colonial Terrace, streetlight damage because of accidents near railroad tracks and another near Circle K.

The Mayor met with KIPDA representative today to get signed in for the ARPA assistance program. Discussion was held. He also spoke about the Metro projects taking place and Robsion Park splash pad closure. Amy Stuber asked about the status of the condos on Ormsby. The Mayor said they haven't started, possibly waiting on material and the road widening on Ormsby is delayed because there are not plans yet in order to bid out. More discussion took place about ARPA funds.
