

**CITY OF LYNDON  
COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES  
MONDAY, MARCH 22, 2021**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Those present: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Camie Popham, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Amy Stuber and City Attorney, John Singler.

A motion was made by Mardy Sidebottom, seconded by Becky Ricketts to approve the minutes of the February 22, 2021 Council Meeting. Motion carried unanimously. Correction of date was made to Caucus Minutes from March 15, 2021. A motion was made by Becky Ricketts, seconded by Carla Nalley to approve the minutes with correction of the March 15, 2021 Caucus Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was given and will be filed for audit. Balance for March 1, 2021 was \$3,504,434.59.

**RESOLUTION #3-22-21- Legislative Body Approving Certified City of Ethics Proposal-**

A motion was made by Susan Barto, seconded by Becky Ricketts to approve Resolution #3-22-21. Motion carried unanimously. All council members must sign the Resolution.

**RESOLUTION #3-22-21A- Establishing 6 Ethics Principles to Govern the Conduct of the City's Officials and Employees-** Council member, Amy Stuber, questioned some of the language in the principles set out by the Kentucky League of Cities (KLC) in order to be certified. John explained to Ms. Stuber the principles in this resolution are part of the KLC program's format and will not be enforcement criteria in the ordinance the City adopts. Discussion was held. Motion was made by Camie Popham, seconded by Mardy Sidebottom to approve Resolution #3-22-21A.

There was also a Resolution on the agenda to authorize the city to enter into an interlocal agreement with newly named cable commission currently under Jefferson County League of Cities. The Interlocal Cooperation Agreement will be under the new name of Kentucky Suburban Cities Cable and Communication Commission. Council member, Becky Ricketts, asked City Attorney, John Singler if he was able to fulfill the duties to represent the City in signing a cable franchise. He informed her he would be able to work on the franchise agreement as he does for other cities. Discussion was held. A motion was made by Susan Barto, seconded by Carla Nalley to terminate the current Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with the Jefferson County League of Cities Cable Commission. A motion was carried unanimous.

**ANNOUNCEMENTS:** Mayor Hagan announced next Caucus Meeting is April 19, 2021 and the Council Meeting is April 26, 2021, both at 6:00p.m. He also announced Shakespeare in the Park, featuring Romeo and Juliet, will be Sunday, May 23, 2021 at 2:00pm weather permitting. He also mentioned the city received the letter from Metro Health Dept. to open splash pad at end of May. The restrooms at Robsion Park will be April 1, 2021 and pavilion rentals are still on hold at this time, it is first come first serve.

**OTHER BUSINESS:**


Topics of the next newsletter were discussed. Ms. Ricketts and Ms. Sidebottom mentioned a few
