

**CITY OF LYNDON
COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, OCTOBER 25, 2021**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Those present: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Camie Popham, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Amy Stuber and City Attorney, John Singler. One guest was also in attendance.

Mayor Hagan noted the agenda listed the Treasurer's Report further down so he gave the total for October 1, 2021 which was \$5,775,042.16.

A motion was made by Becky Ricketts, seconded by Mardy Sidebottom to approve the minutes of the September 27, 2021 Council Meeting. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Susan Barto, seconded by Amy Stuber to approve the minutes of the October 18, 2021 Caucus Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

MUNICIPAL ORDER #10-25-21A- Authorization Transfer of Property to City of Lyndon – Mayor Hagan explained reason for the transfer and location of the property which is near the properties in floodplain the City purchased at the end of Witawanga to avoid development. The Landbank Authority is transferring parcel to the City for \$1.00. Motion made by Becky Ricketts, seconded by Betsy Kramer to approve Municipal Order #10-25-21A. Motion carried unanimously.

MUNICIPAL ORDER #10-25-21- Declaring City Vehicle Surplus Property- Mayor Hagan informed council in order to sell Chevrolet Impala it will need to be declared surplus. Motion was made by Susan Barto, seconded by Carla Nalley to approve Municipal Order #10-25-21. Motion carried unanimously. Discussion was held.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Mayor Hagan announced next Caucus Meeting is November 15, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. Immediately following will be the KLC Ethics training session with Chris Johnson, dinner will be served. Council Meeting is November 22, 2021, at 6:00p.m.

OTHER BUSINESS: Light Up Lyndon discussion on dates and details were held. Proposed date will be December 5th once Mayor confirms bookings with entertainment. He will send an email to council when more information is established.

Mardy Sidebottom asked about status of Ormsby Lane widening. Mayor Hagan informed her the construction plans by design firm must be finalized first to bid out project. Start date will be announced later. Ms. Sidebottom also asked if the cost will be covered by funds the City received. Mayor Hagan confirmed most of project qualifies, except the sidewalk, for return through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds. The City has received half of the refund, \$1,479,000. Discussion was held. Mayor announced the trees around the LG&E substation that died were replanted last Friday.

Becky Ricketts talked about advertising for Light Up and asked if JCLC dinner reservation have been made. Mayor stated has a table of 8 reserved.


OPEN FLOOR: Nevelle Blakemore, candidate for Jefferson County Clerk, introduced himself and expressed why he is running for office.
