

**CITY OF LYNDON
CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, NOVEMBER 21, 2022**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Those present: Susan Barto, Carla Nalley, Camie Popham, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Amy Stuber and City Attorney, John Singler. Council member, Betsy Kramer, was absent. Guests were present.

Mayor Hagan listed the items on the agenda for next Monday. The 2nd reading of Ordinance 10-24-22A (Establishing use of red and blue lights on police cars) with additional municipal orders for interlocal agreements for police services with cities. Also, two resolutions regarding bond issue amendments for Goodwill and Southern Baptist Seminary. Mike Herrington, representative for Stites and Harbison PLLC explained the process of calculating of interest rate will change for the loans involved in the bond process so council would understand the need for the amendment.

The Mayor informed the council he traveled to Chicago to pick out the vehicles that were approved to purchase at the last council meeting. He was able to get 5 for \$78,000. They are currently getting equipped by a local dealer so they can be on the road soon. Over the next few years, the Mayor explained the vehicles will be rotated out to receive newer models on a 5-year leasing program. Further discussion was held. For clarification, Amy Stuber asked how many paid employees are on the police staff. Mayor Hagan replied Chief, Deputy Chief, 25 full-time officers, 2 part-time officers, 2 detectives.

Mayor Hagan told the council about a meeting that was held at City Hall with a few neighbors and Metro Code Enforcement representative regarding 419 Wood Rd. Metro has requested Lyndon Police participation in staying on top of the property owners of any violations present. Ms. Stuber asked about the result of the criminal case against them involving one the boarders. City Attorney, John Singler stated he would find out.

Ms. Nalley asked about Juvenile Detention Center updates. Mayor Hagan stated after a meeting with Justice Cabinet secretary, police chief, fire chief and himself, all the youth that were in the Lyndon location have been transported to Adair Co. because of violations in the building. More discussion was held. In the future, juveniles will be held at the Lyndon location only for processing and then taken to more secure detention in Adair Co. to stay.

Becky Ricketts congratulated Mayor Hagan on his Peyton Hoge award for his public service given to him at the Jefferson County League of Cities dinner last week. Council acknowledged the Mayor as well.


Pam Pringle spoke of food pantry at her church.
