

**CITY OF LYNDON  
CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES  
MONDAY, MARCH 21, 2022**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Those present: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Camie Popham, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Amy Stuber and City Attorney, John Singler. Carla Nalley was absent. One guest was present.

Mayor Hagan began meeting with discussing a bank franchise and local deposits tax to impose on financial institutions to generate more revenue for Lyndon. According to the amount of deposits maintained in preceding year a fee, not to exceed 0.025, may be imposed on the institution. Many cities in Jefferson County have already imposed this tax. Lyndon currently has 5 financial institutions this will affect. This will need to be approved by ordinance.

The Mayor also mentioned business license fees (Chapter 110.01) have not been updated for many years. Currently, the fee is \$75 annually and about 25% of business are delinquent yearly. Currently there is no penalty schedule for being delinquent. Discussion was held. Amendment to the ordinance will be on agenda for Monday night's council meeting. Also, a first reading will be on agenda regarding establishing pay rate for elected officials.


