

**CITY OF LYNDON
CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 2022**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Caucus Meeting to order at 6:15 p.m. Those present: Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Camie Popham, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Amy Stuber (remotely) and City Attorney, John Singler. Guests were present.


Mayor Hagan called on Police Chief, Grady Throneberry to introduce the new Deputy Chief, Rob Schroeder. He spoke of his time with Louisville Metro where he retired and his continued studies with which is now has a PhD in Leadership. He excited to be back working with police.

A few topics were discussed while the Chief and Deputy Chief were present. Betsy Kramer asked about status of property on her street that has been an issue. Mayor Hagan mentioned he is interested in coordinating a meeting with neighbors, police, Metro and Lyndon officials to discuss the conditions of the property so that everyone is understanding the role of Lyndon and Louisville Metro. Also, Mardy Sidebottom inquired about the Juvenile Justice Detention Center and the recent criminal activity taking place. After much discussion, Mayor Hagan suggested having concerned residents call the State Juvenile Justice Commissioner and elected state officials. Amy Stuber recommended a write up in the newsletter how and who to direct those concerns.

Mayor Hagan presented four legal actions that will be on agenda next Monday night. Municipal Order 9-26-22 to extend snow contract for two more years at same current price. Ordinance 9-26-22A to amend the 2022-2023 budget, capital projects line, for the purchase of real property at 908 Ormsby Lane. Municipal Order 9-26-22B for the Interlocal Agreement between Lyndon Police and the City of Hurstbourne concerning provisions of police services. Lastly, Municipal Order 9-26-22C to approve use of ARPA funds to provide premium pay for Jefferson County Fire Protection Staff. Discussion was held on the specifics of this last order regarding how much to contribute.

Pamela Pringle, volunteer of Lyndon Baptist food pantry, spoke about number served and meat items they were able to hand out. Mardy Sidebottom asked which agency a resident would contact regarding sidewalk installation on New LaGrange Rd. Mayor informed her to have them ask their Metro Councilmember.

Meeting was adjourned at 6:52 p.m.
