

**CITY OF LYNDON
CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, APRIL 17, 2023**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Those present: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Becky Ricketts, Amy Stuber and City Attorney, John Singler. Mardy Sidebottom and Vicki Stanley were absent.

Mayor Hagan asked council members to look at budget packet worksheets that were given to them. A first reading of the budget will be next Monday, the 24th. The Mayor went through and explained line items of the budget. Much of the discussion focused on increasing costs of contracts, the major police and capital project expenses. Further discussion was held regarding future revenue.


The Mayor also announced the first reading of the tax ordinance on next week's agenda. The tax rate is proposed to increase from .12 to .13. This will require a tax hearing and notice of recall of the 4% compensation rate after the city receives the preliminary printout from the Property Valuation Administrator's office on April 21st and calculations are made.

Mayor Hagan mentioned the last item on agenda for next week is the first reading for a zoning change from C-N to C-2 at 8100 Lyndon Park Lane. The minutes from the Louisville Metro Planning Commission will be distributed to council members as soon as the city receives them. He also stated both landscaping and sanitation must be bid out this year. Discussion was held.

The last few items the Mayor mentioned is the Municipal Road Aid Hearing has been advertised and will be during the Council Meeting next week as a line item. The Ormsby Lane Rd. drainage and road improvement project has been advertised for bid. As brought up earlier in the budget discussion, two future projects to be bid out soon. Those include the Lyndon Lane sidewalk improvements to remove the trees and fill in the swells ordered by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) and also the Lyndon Lane parking lot that will be located next to the pickleball development at Lyndon Park Lane. Discussion was held. Lastly, Mayor Hagan spoke about the Hamlet production on Sunday. The weather did not allow an outside performance, so it was moved to Lyndon City Hall.

No other business was discussed.
