CITY OF LYNDON CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES MONDAY, JULY 17, 2023

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Those present: Susan Barto, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Amy Stuber, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley and City Attorney, John Singler. Vicki Stanley was absent.

Mayor Hagan updated council on recent storm debris collection. The city is finished collecting debris in the right of way from last months wind event. Remaining material is subject to Rumpke collection guidelines.

The Mayor reflected on two recent meetings with Governor Beshear. He and Chief Schroeder were presented a check for \$26,483 from the Law Enforcement Protection Program. Most recently, he and the Chief met again with the Governor and other local law enforcement Chiefs to discuss how the State could be more helpful.

The property reserved for future police headquarters was discussed. Mayor Hagan presented a timeline for completion and renderings of the proposed design.

More discussion was held on an occupational tax to generate revenue. A first reading will be on the agenda for Council meeting.

Besty Kramer asked about a potential drainage/standing water issue on Beech Rd. The Mayor said he would investigate.

Angie Miles-Merrick, guest and retired Lyndon Police officer introduced herself to council and exclaimed she would attend more meetings in the future. She was thanked for her service.
