
Mayor Hagan reminded council the second reading and action for the Occupational Tax Ordinance will be on agenda next Monday. Sample forms from Middletown for registration and implementing the tax were given to Lyndon and handed out to the council to look over. The office will send out a postcard with an announcement of the adopted tax to all businesses. The Mayor stated the City will eventually create an office position to handle all of the business and occupational tax inquiries. Discussion was held.

Hazardous tree requests have come in since the storm in June and Mayor Hagan has been working with the City Arborist to determine the status of those trees. Letters have been sent out to those declared hazardous and if there is no response or communication from property owners, the city can enforce removal by ordinance. Discussion was held.

Mayor Hagan informed council the Ormsby Lane road and drainage project is being held up by MSD paperwork. Discussion was held.

Police Chief, Rob Schroeder attended the meeting. He spoke about a recent accident on LaGrange Rd and radar equipment updates. He also stated he and the Mayor had a meeting with Governor Beshear to discuss crime strategies and training for officers. Susan Barto invited the Chief to a KLC Insurance Retreat and Committee meeting this week. There was further discussion about KLC upcoming training opportunities.
