**CITY OF LYNDON
COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, FEBRUARY 27, 2023**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Those present: Susan Barto, Betsy Kramer, Carla Nalley, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Vicki Stanley and City Attorney, John Singler. Amy Stuber was absent. Guests were present.

A motion was made by Becky Ricketts, seconded by Mardy Sidebottom to approve the minutes of the January 23, 2023 Council Meeting. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Susan Barto, seconded by Carla Nalley to approve the minutes of the February 20, 2023 Special Meeting. Motion carried unanimously. A motion was made by Vicki Stanley, seconded by Betsy Kramer to approve the minutes of the February 20, 2023 Caucus Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

The Treasurer's Report was given and will be filed for audit. Ending balance for February 1, 2023 was \$4,375,702.82.

ORDINANCE #2-27-23A – 1st Reading – Amending and Adding Short Term Rental to the Lyndon Land Development Code - A motion was made by Betsy Kramer, seconded by Carla Nalley to have City Attorney John Singler to give a first reading by summary of Ordinance 2-27-23A. Motion carried. Mr. Singler gave a first reading. Discussion was held. A motion was made by Betsy Kramer, seconded by Carla Nalley to discuss further at the March Caucus Meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

APPOINTMENT OF LYNDON POLICE CHIEF - Mayor Hagan stated his recommendation to promote Rob Schroeder from Deputy Chief to Chief of Police for Lyndon's Police Department. A motion was made by Becky Ricketts, seconded by Mardy Sidebottom to approve the appointment. The Mayor also introduced Chris Thomas, promoted to Deputy Chief, and two detectives who were in attendance, Andy Hawkins and Mark Wampler. Chief Schroeder spoke about the integrity of his team of officers and thanked the city for the promotion.

RESOLUTION #2-27-23 – Opposing KY Legislative Senate Bill 50 and House Bill 50 Relating to Partisan Local Elections – A motion was made by Becky Ricketts, seconded by Susan Barto to adopt Resolution #2-27-23 to oppose the legislative bills. Motion carried unanimously.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Mayor Hagan announced the date of the next Caucus Meeting, March 20, 2023 and the next Council Meeting is March 27, 2023 at 6:00p.m. Two events coming up in April will be discussed at next meeting, Shakespeare in the Park and the Easter celebration.


OTHER BUSINESS: Betsy Kramer asked about the pothole on Beech Ave she has mentioned before. Mayor Hagan stated MSD is aware along with District 18, Daniel Lockett. It is on MSD's list for repair.

OPEN FLOOR: Tim Hawkins, resident of Lyndon, informed council that he called his state representative to oppose the HB50 and SB50 as discussed with the adoption of Resolution #2-27-23. Discussion was held.

Amadou Diallo, Lyndon resident, candidate of 2022 City Council elections and first-time attendee of council meeting, asked why trains blow horns at the Lyndon Lane crossing and not others. Mayor Hagan informed him of a death that occurred years ago at this intersection and as part of the settlement, trains must blow horns at this location. Mr. Singler added the crossings must meet certain criteria and the cost to make it a quiet zone is significant.

Dave Barker, resident of Ormsby Lane asked for an update of the widening plans. Mayor Hagan stated the City finally has the plans. There are phases of the project and once finalized, the project will be out for bid.
