

**CITY OF LYNDON  
CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES  
MONDAY, MAY 15, 2023**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Council Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Those present: Susan Barto, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Vicki Stanley, Amy Stuber and City Attorney, John Singler. Betsy Kramer and Carla Nalley were absent.

Mike Herrington, Stites and Harbison PLLC, who also came before the council in November of last year to explain a change in the way interest is calculated for bonds the City has issued. At this time, an amendment is needed for the YMCA bond. A resolution will be on the agenda for next Monday night to approve.

Mayor Hagan updated council on two bids that were due today. There has been an extension for the Ormsby Lane widening project to June 19<sup>th</sup> to amend the specs. Sanitation bids were due today and the city only received one from the current hauler, Rumpke for \$833,892 each year for 5 years, a 37% increase. The Mayor explained all cities bidding waste are dealing with this major increase. Discussion was held.

The budget spreadsheet up for 2<sup>nd</sup> reading and action next week will change on the sanitation line item based on the bid and the Mayor will provide that before next Monday. Also the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading for the tax ordinance and the zoning change at 8100 Lyndon Park Lane will be on the agenda. Discussion was held regarding the public/private partnership on the parking lot to be built on city property.


More discussion was held on an occupational tax to generate revenue, update on renovations of future police building.

Vicki Stanley inquired about council getting crime report. Mayor informed her general information is on our website and starting next year at budget time, we will have a yearly report. Ms. Stanley thanked the Mayor for the radar machine results for the Holly Springs neighborhood meeting.

Amy Stuber spoke to owner of 315 Wood Rd. about the trees in the park. The Mayor informed her Bob Ray will be there next week to start cleaning up and removing hazardous trees that are marked. She also brought up another tree across from her that is also hazardous and Mayor said he will review that.


