

**CITY OF LYNDON
CAUCUS MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 18, 2023**

Mayor Brent Hagan called the Caucus Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Those present:, Betsy Kramer, Becky Ricketts, Mardy Sidebottom, Amy Stuber and City Attorney, John Singler. Absent: Susan Barto, Carla Nalley, Vicki Stanley. One guest was present.

Mayor talked about Fall Festival details. October 1st, 2-6pm. Flyers will be on social media and signs out in beautification tomorrow. Music entertainment by young, local guitarist and the Crashers, tree giveaway, pumpkins, bouncy houses and food trucks will all be highlighted.

Update on Police headquarters was given. Engineers have reviewed plan and it will be filed with Metro Planning and Zoning. The Mayor is hoping to present the final plans for bidding interest in December. He also mentioned the Ormsby Lane widening project and made council aware of a new structural curb project that is high priority on Forest Green Blvd. Discussions were held.


Mayor Hagan asked City Attorney, John Singler if last municipal order for remaining 2023 ARPA funds rolls over every year or is it required to approve one each year. Mr. Singler suggested to approve a new order for each year.

The Mayor started discussion on a few police matters. He brought up an interest in a steering committee involving Mayor, Police Chief, and other committee members similar to what St. Matthews currently conducts. Mr. Singler agreed it was a good idea to be transparent with police affairs. Meetings would be subject to open meetings requirements and minutes taken. This topic lead to other items of discussion regarding the police equipment, vehicles and reports.

Discussion was held on current situation at 419 Wood Rd. The Mayor let council know the JCLC Dinner will be November 16th if interested in attending. More Fall Festival discussion took place along with Foxboro annexation and occupational tax details.



Amy Stuber asked if Bowen Elementary afternoon traffic was alleviated. Mayor stated both school plans are going well and most temporary issues have been resolved. He stated the KYTC is reviewing the turning lane and may have to make changes. He also brought up Metro road work/repaving on Ormsby Station, UPS Drive and Millbrook will begin soon.
