## Mayor's Message

It has been a very active half a year in Lyndon. Recently, the council passed our budget and set our property tax rate for the upcoming fiscal year, which remains unchanged at .13 per \$100. The budget was the most challenging I've proposed in my 8 years of service, however, I believe we continue to manage your dollars well. The operation of our own police department is a substantial but necessary expenditure. In a world where crime knows no boundaries, our investment in public safety is crucial to maintaining Lyndon as a coveted place to reside, work, and enjoy life. As the price of everything has risen substantially in the last few years, we had to find ways to raise revenue to cover the cost of basic, essential services. I've discussed that in previous newsletters. The occupational tax we imposed raised one million dollars in the first quarter. This new revenue stream ensures that everyone who benefits from our city's amenities, whether they are homeowners or employees, contribute their fair share to the community's upkeep.

We are pleased to announce that construction of the new police headquarters is moving forward. After a meticulous second-round bidding process, the contract has been awarded to Miranda Construction. This project stands as a testament to our commitment to public safety and the well-being of our law enforcement personnel.

I regret to inform some of our pickleball fans that the development project at Lyndon Park Lane will not proceed as initially planned. The journey of the Lyndon Park Lane project has taken an unexpected turn. Due to financial complications with the initial operator, we've had to rethink our strategy. Let me clarify that the city never intended to invest \$15million of your money in an entertainment complex. We were going to sell that property to a developer with certain covenants that would reflect our needs for community space. Nonetheless, we are not deterred. A new request for proposals is on the horizon, and in the meantime, the site will continue to provide additional parking and public space next to Robsion Park. We envision a versatile venue for activities like outdoor concerts, food trucks, art exhibits, and more. This is an opportunity to create a communal haven in Lyndon - a place for families, friends, and neighbors to come together.

Looking Ahead, as we continue to navigate through these projects, we remain focused on transparency and open communication with our community. Your input and support are invaluable to us, and we encourage all residents to stay engaged with the city's ongoing and future initiatives.

As always, it's an honor to serve Lyndon.

## Safety Tips: Telephone Scams

In the modern world, telephones have become an increasingly large part of our lives. Unfortunately, criminals have learned how to use our phones as a tool to defraud people of their life savings. Often the targets of these scams are the elderly and other vulnerable populations. Here are a few tips to help keep you and your hard-earned savings safe:

- **Guard your personal information:** Be cautious if someone calls you unexpectedly and asks for personal information or passwords. Often these callers seem nice and helpful. If you believe it may be legitimate, call the organization back at a known phone number. Doublecheck the phone number via an Internet search. You may find other victims reporting the scam online.
- **Imposters:** Scammers may pretend to be from a government agency or company. Law enforcement agencies will NEVER ask for money to avoid arresting you for an outstanding warrant or other criminal charge. Contact your local law enforcement immediately.
- **Asking for payment:** No government agency or legitimate business will ask that you pay by gift cards, bitcoin or other digital currency, or by immediately wiring money. These agencies and businesses will not ask you to send money to get your money back or to get a larger sum of money. They will not ask for your bank account numbers or ask you to withdraw money from retirement accounts.
- **Resist Pressure:** Scammers will often pressure you to act quickly. Scammers may also try to use fear or intimidation to get what they want. People who are genuinely trying to help will not.

Following these tips can help to reduce the likelihood of becoming the victim of a scam. If you believe you have been victimized or have questions regarding a situation you may be involved in, immediately contact the police at 502-574-5471 (911 for Emergencies).
